LEATHER SASHES: Basic maintenance

Regular care helps your sash looking its best, especially after big events:

1 CLEAN

Wipe your sash down with a damp rag, use some soap if needed.

2 DRY

Wipe off the excess moisture with a dry towel.

3 CONDITION

Treat the sash with a thin layer of leather conditioner and let it soak in for a couple of minutes.

4 BRUSH

Gently wipe or brush the excess off and you're good to go!

Storage:

If you're not traveling, store the sash hanging in a dry and airy place, and keep away from moisture to prevent mold.

Faux leather:

Clean with a damp rag, keep out of direct sunlight for storage, and use cleaning and care products formulated for synthetics if needed.





RECOMMENDED PRODUCTS

- Clean rags, e.g. cut-up old shirt, old dish towel
- If needed, sparingly use mild glycerine soap on your damp rag to get rid of sticky residue.
- Clean horsehair brush (don't use your dirty shoe brush!); you can also use a clean rag or a clean nylon stocking instead for buffing. If you're feeling fancy or have a sash with lots of intricate detail, you can get a softer goat hair brush.
- A light conditioning cream or lotion that doesn't darken the leather is highly recommended, especially with intricate designs. Heavy dubbin might darken coloured leather. If in doubt, ask a bootblack about product recommendations available locally.

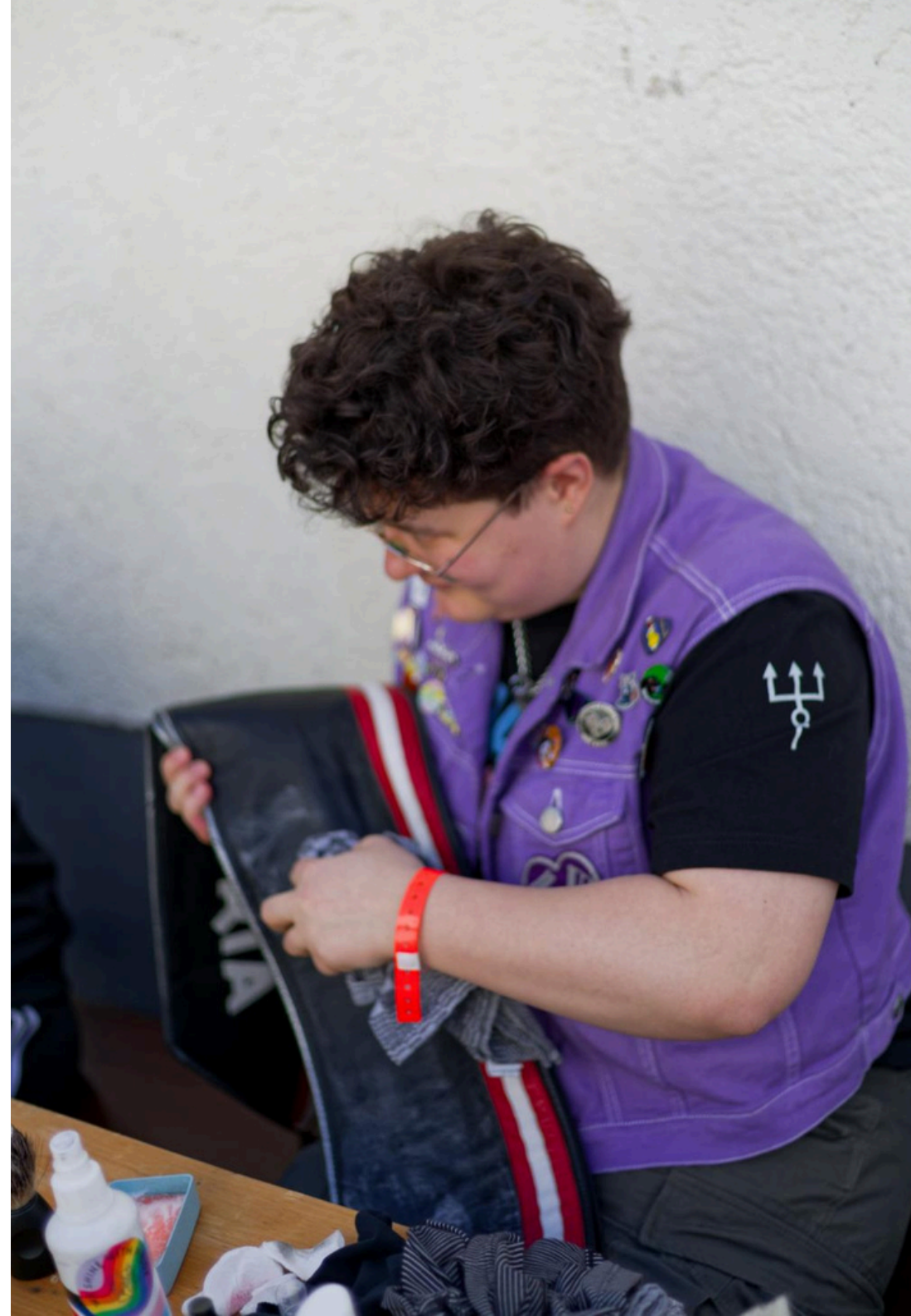
LEATHER SASHES: Glitter, stains & grime

The **usual grime** from regular wear is easily cleaned with a damp rag. You can also use some mild soap if needed.

Got doused in beer or liquor? First aid: Carefully pat the sash dry with paper towels and be careful with colours bleeding out (no rubbing!). Clean with a damp rag afterwards, you can use some mild glycerine soap if needed to get rid of sticky residue.

Glitter is removed most easily with a dry microfiber dusting cloth.

Red leather is known for being difficult to handle: The colour tends to bleed out when it gets wet (e.g. getting rained on, during cleaning, contact with leather conditioner) and might stain other parts of the sash/your clothes. Carefully clean and condition red leather separate from the other colours, especially white.





RUBBER SASHES

If you're holding a rubber title, you're probably well versed in rubber care already, but just in case here are some basics to keep in mind:

- The most important thing to remember when handling your rubber sash is the colour and thickness of the rubber used for the lettering and decorative details.
- While black rubber is quite resilient, white, translucent, semi-translucent and light-coloured rubber is prone to **colour transfer** when touched, so avoid touching different coloured rubber, as well as materials such as leather and copper.
- **Storage:** Store in a dark, cool place. Plastic zip bags are a tried and tested storage solution. Push the air out before closing the bag to prevent oxidation. Alternatively, you can store it on a hanger in a garment bag.

RUBBER SASHES

- Often, a shine with your preferred shining oil at the start of an event is enough to get you through the whole weekend.
- It's recommended to wash your rubber sash after extended wear (e.g. an event weekend) with a specialized cleaner; Viviclean works particularly well on keeping white rubber looking fresh.
- Afterwards, bathe it in a solution of water and a dash of your preferred shining oil to prevent the rubber from sticking together during storage. You can use talcum powder instead if you prefer.

FABRIC SASHES (e.g. Sportswear titles)

- Use water and gentle soap for spot treatment, bring it to the dry cleaner's if necessary.
- Let the sash dry and air out after each wear to get rid of moisture.
- Storage: store in a dry breathable fabric bag, as mould might develop in a plastic bag.
- Command strips will help keeping the sash in place on slippery fabrics.

AFTER THE SASH:

Caring for your Titleholder Vest

- Same basic rules as for leather sashes apply. Give the vest a gentle damp wipe-down after extended wear and sparingly treat it with a light conditioner afterwards.
- Store your vest on a hanger in a dry and airy place and keep it away from moisture to prevent mould.
- White salt stains: Use mild soap and water to get rid of salt stains that might form from sweat.
- If in doubt, ask a bootblack for help.
